FEDERATIONS INVITED	The Organizing Member Federation will invite all Member Federations in good standing.

AGE LIMITS	MAG Juniors, as per FIG technical regulations MAG Seniors, as per FIG technical regulations <i>NFs must declare through the gymnast's FIG profile whether their 18-year-old gymnasts will compete as junior or senior prior to their first competition for the year concerned (according to FIG Technical Regulations 2026, Section 1, Art. 5.2 Age of Participants).</i> WAG Juniors, as per FIG technical regulations WAG Seniors, as per FIG technical regulations All gymnasts must have a FIG license valid until the end of the event.						
JUDGES AND JURIES	For MAG and WAG, Senior and Junior, the participating member federations must send qualified judges according to the following rules (MAG and WAG): - 1 Junior OR 1 Senior Team = 1 judge - 1 Junior Team AND 1 Senior Team = 2 Teams = 2 judges - 1 – 3 Junior individuals OR 1 – 3 Senior individuals = 1 judge - 1 – 3 Junior individuals AND 1 – 3 Senior individuals = 2 judges - (1 Junior Team OR 1 Senior Team) AND (1 – 3 Junior individuals OR 1 – 3 Senior individuals) = 2 judges - 1 Junior Team AND 1 Senior Team AND (1 – 3 Junior individuals OR 1 – 3 Senior individuals) = 3 judges - (1 Junior Team OR 1 Senior Team) AND 1 – 3 Junior individuals AND 1 – 3 Senior individuals = 3 judges - 1 Junior Team AND 1 Senior Team AND 1 – 3 Junior individuals AND 1 – 3 Senior individuals = 4 judges All judges must have a current valid FIG brevet at the time of the event, for the respective discipline. Time and Line may be National judges. Failure to provide judges as mentioned above at the time of the definitive registration will result in a LOC charge of 1.000 EUR per judge to the federation concerned (non-refundable). This fine must be received on the FLGym account not later than 25 February 2026. Depending on the number of participating teams and judges, the LOC will determine the number of Apparatus Juries (judges' panels). Judges will have to judge Junior and Senior competitions.

ENTRY FEES	No Entry Fee will be applied for this event for all delegation members who book their accommodation through the LOC. Delegations that will not book their accommodation through the LOC will have to pay an entry fee of EUR 150 per person. The payment to the LOC <u>must be received</u> on the account no later than 25 January 2026 (refer to “bank account information” below). The entry fee is non-refundable. Entries without payment of the entry fees in time will be considered as invalid and will be refused.						
ACCREDITATION	Accreditation will be given to all members of the delegation upon arrival and when all costs have been paid. In addition, the LOC will distribute information regarding the gymnasts' safeguarding plan.

VISA	Please verify immediately with your travel agent or the Luxembourg Embassy or Consulate in your country if a visa is required for your travel to Luxembourg. The LOC will be happy to assist each Delegation member with an official invitation letter, provided that the request is made before 25 February 2026 to the LOC. To request an invitation letter, please send the following information to the LOC: Full Name, Gender, Date of Birth, Citizenship, Passport Number, Passport Expiry Date, Function/Role within the Delegation, Arrival and Departure Dates, City where the visa application support letter should be sent. Please ensure that all information is complete and accurate to avoid delays in visa processing.										
INSURANCE	The Host Federation, the LOC and the FIG will not be held responsible for any liabilities in the event of accidents, illness (including COVID-19), repatriation, or similar occurrences. In accordance with the FIG Technical Regulations, all participating Federations are responsible for ensuring that all Delegation Members have valid insurance coverage for illness, accidents, and repatriation during the entire duration of their stay. It is mandatory that Delegation Members are covered by basic insurance (covering sickness, accident, and repatriation) in their country of residence, in order to benefit from coverage by the FIG IMSSA subsidiary insurance. Each Delegation must present either a cover note or a photocopy of the valid insurance policy. The policy must be valid starting from the day of arrival and must remain valid for the entire duration of the stay.										

SAFEGUARDING	From the official day of arrival until the official day of departure, all participants — including gymnasts, coaches, judges, and other Delegation Members — will have the possibility to contact the LOC Safeguarding Officer by phone or email in case of: • Harassment • Abuse of any kind • Any situation where they feel uncomfortable or unsafe The contact information for the LOC Safeguarding Officer will be provided to all Delegations upon arrival on site. As part of the FIG's commitment to athlete welfare and youth protection, posters of the “10 Golden Rules of Gymnastics”, part of the FIG's awareness campaign, must be clearly displayed in several key areas, including: • Training Halls • Warm-Up Areas • Public Zones These measures are in place to ensure a safe, respectful, and supportive environment for all participants throughout the event.
INTERNATIONAL TRANSPORTATION	The invited participating delegations must pay for the travel costs of their delegation members. The Travel Schedule Form must be returned to the LOC by 25 February 2026.
LOCAL TRANSPORTATION	Local transportation between Luxembourg Airport (LUX)/ Luxembourg train station and the official hotel as well as between the official hotels and the competition venue will be provided by the LOC for all delegation members from the official arrival day to the official departure day. All delegations that have not booked their accommodation with the LOC have to organize their local transportation on their own. Pickup and drop-off at the airport/ train station can only be guaranteed if the Travel Schedule Form is returned to the LOC by 25 February 2026. Delegations arriving earlier and departing later than the specified event period have to organize and pay for their local transport outside the covered event slot themselves.
ACCOMMODATION	The invited participating federations must pay for the accommodation expenses of their delegation members. While the Accommodation Form must be returned to the LOC by 25 January 2026 at the very latest, the Hotel rooms will be allocated on a “first come, first serve” basis. CANCELTION POLICY	The whole amount will be refunded for cancellations by the federations submitted before 25 January 2026. For any partial or total cancellation after 25 January 2026 by the federations, no money will be refunded. If accommodation and other services are

	booked after the respective deadlines, the amount is due immediately and no money is refunded in case of a cancellation by the federations. If the event has to be cancelled due to force majeure, the LOC will try to provide a refund of the costs but the financial responsibility for all costs remains with the NFs. Therefore, the LOC strongly recommends that all NFs purchase a travel cancellation insurance.
